

Recommended Day Pack Contents Listing

Troop 108, Fort Mill, SC

- _____ School sized back pack for Scout to carry WITH HIM each day while in camp
- _____ Money for snacks/crafts at camp or food on the car trip up and back when required.
- _____ Glasses – with hard case for day pack – if applicable.
- _____ Sunglasses with head strap
- _____ Hat/Cap – Scout appropriate
- _____ Sun protection – Sun Screen for skin and Chapstick for lips.
- _____ Bug/Tick Spray.
- _____ Water Bottle or Canteen to pour cold bottled water into for transport around camp.
- _____ Small First Aid Kit with moleskin for treating blisters
- _____ Whistle for Emergency
- _____ Mess Kit – small bowl and camp style eating utensils (Scouts in Tenderfoot, Second Class or First Class programs or taking Wilderness Survival).
- _____ Small Flashlight with extra batteries. Head Lamps are recommended
- _____ Matches -Only if you have earned BSA “Fire M Chit”
- _____ Pocket Knife – Only if you have earned BSA “Tote N Chip”
- _____ Scout Handbook
- _____ Pens or Pencils
- _____ Notebook or notepad
- _____ Change of socks.
- _____ Towel/Extra Clothes if the campout includes water sports
- _____ Snack Food (No gum or chocolate please). Some examples are: dried fruit (raisins, cherries, apricots, and apples), trail mix, nuts, beef/turkey jerky, protein bars
- _____ Work Gloves for campsite work or service projects
- _____ Extra Zip lock baggies for cool treasures found or wet socks.
- _____ Knot tying cord. Suggest paracord in a four to six foot length.
- _____ Lightweight Poncho or Raincoat
- _____ Small roll of toilet paper in a zip-lock bag
- _____ Hand sanitizer

Other Information:

Scouts may bring smart phones (with the parent's permission) for use as a digital camera. The adult leaders will not tolerate smart phones being used as music players and gaming devices. The adult leaders prefer that the scouts bring an inexpensive digital camera or a disposable 35mm camera.

Scouts are encouraged to divide up their money for the week and to “hide” it in several different places in their gear. That way if they lose the money that they have with them, they haven't lost it all.

Scouts are told not to ask adult leaders to loan them money. Any scout loaning money to another scout should consider their “loan” to be a gift to the other scout and not expect to be paid back. Adult leaders will not referee disputes over loaned money.

All clothing must be scout appropriate. T-shirts don't have to be scouting specific, but cannot be of a questionable nature.
